PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO THE STANDING ORDERS

To amend Standing Order 10.3.1 by inserting "not be eligible for the AIP Referral Program until completion of the required continuing education"

Amendment 10.3.1 now reads:

10.3.1 A Certified Professional Parliamentarian (CPP) or a Certified Parliamentarian (CP) member who fails to complete the continuing education requirement and timely submit proof thereof during his or her seven-year period shall revert to the next lower classification of membership. CPP shall revert to a CP classification and a CP shall revert to a member classification. The member shall be required to complete the required examination to be reinstated in his or her previous classification.

Amend by inserting:

"not be eligible for the AIP Referral Program until completion of the required continuing education"

If adopted would read:

10.3.1 A Certified Professional Parliamentarian (CPP) or a Certified Parliamentarian (CP) member who fails to complete the continuing education requirement and timely submit proof thereof during his or her seven-year period shall revert to the next lower classification of membership. CPP shall revert to a CP classification and not be eligible for the AIP Referral Program until completion of the required continuing education A CP shall revert to a member classification. The member shall be required to complete the required examination to be reinstated in his or her previous classification.

Rationale: Submission of the continuing education is not difficult. The member who neglects this task isn't interested in maintaining his or her status and receiving referrals.

It's in the Bylaws!

How many times have you been asked where to find something about the quorum for a meeting or what is the term limit for officers?

Very few members give the bylaws a second thought until they have a problem. Last year we had no bylaw amendments. Does that mean that our documents of authority are perfect? I doubt it.

So let's give them a fresh review. According to our bylaws, amendments to the bylaws may be offered at every annual session according to either of the following procedures:

Section 1. Amendment with Notice. Following notice of amendment given to all members with the official notice of the annual session, a two-thirds vote of members present and voting at the annual session will be required.

Section 2. Amendment Without Notice. If notice has not been given as stated in Section 1-1, then a member must give twelve hours' notice of the amendment and there must be a two-thirds vote in the affirmative to consider an amendment. Amendments proposed by this method require a four-fifths vote of members present and voting at the annual session to adopt. Debate on the motion to consider shall be confined to the merits of consideration.

The Bylaws Committee members have been reviewing the bylaws and in an effort to save time in the business meeting request that proposed amendments to the bylaws and standing rules be sent to the committee by May 15.

I can't imagine an annual meeting without bylaws amendments. Please take time to read our documents of authority. They are available on the website.


